

Tajikistan 2021 Annual Country Report Highlights



The United Nations World Food Programme (WFP) is helping the Government of Tajikistan to build a wellnourished nation, by supporting social protection, promoting school feeding, reducing malnutrition, building resilience to climate change and preparing for recurring natural disasters.

Beneficiaries by Modality



663,900 total actual food beneficiaries in 2021 (333,291 female and 330,609 male)



10,982 total actual CBT (cashbased transfer) beneficiaries in 2021 (5,158 female and 5,824 male)



46,830 total actual capacity strengthening beneficiaries in 2021 (5,158 female and 20,629 male)



2,844 estimated number of persons with disabilities (44% female and 56% male

Strategic Outcome Highlights in 2021

Strategic Outcome 01: Food-insecure vulnerable people, including primary schoolchildren, meet their basic food requirements by 2024



2,000 schools were covered by the school meals



programme



Strategic Outcome 03: Targeted food-insecure communities in areas vulnerable to climate change have increased their resilience to shocks by 2024



30,000 beneficiaries were supported through emergency cash for assets



One-off mixed food commodities were provided to 2,027 affected households

WFP supported the construction of **70 houses** that had been completely or partially destroyed by earthquake

Strategic Outcome 02: Reduce level of malnutrition of vulnerable groups, especially aged 6-59 months and pregnant and lactating women by 2024



6,207 beneficiaries covered by moderate acute malnutrition (MAM) treatment



267 health workers trained on MAM treatment



250 primary healthcare centers assisted

Strategic Outcome 04: Government institutions have strengthened capacities to target, design and implement effective food security and nutrition strategies by 2024



School Feeding Centre was established under the Ministry of Education and Science of Tajikistan



8 bakeries were **renovated** and **constructed**

Strategic Outcome 05: Humanitarian and development actors and national system have access to services and expertise in the areas of logistics, procurement and administration



1,316 MT of wheat-flour were procured from the local market and delivered to Afghanistan

Logistic support was provided to the **United Nations** Humanitarian Air Service (UNHAS) flights between Dushanbe – Kabul and other Afghan destinations
