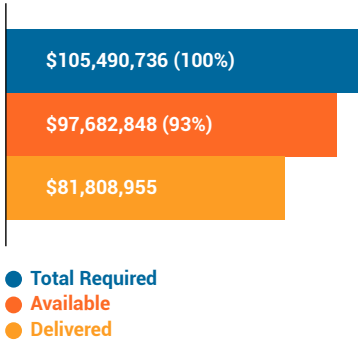

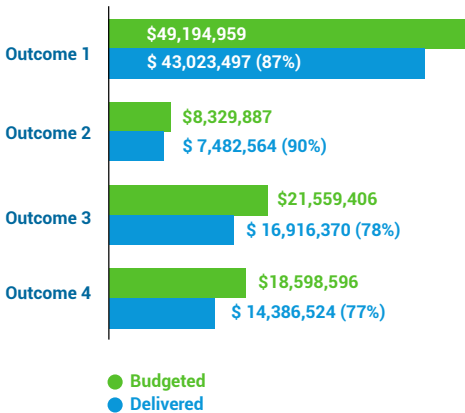

Budgeted vs Delivered by Outcomes





Outcome 1: Inclusive Human Development



3,700 refugees and asylum seekers benefited from social protection interventions.



\$740,000 allocated by Government for UN-supported State RH Programme



Developed Inclusive education Mid-term Education Action Plan 2024-2026 (MTEAP).



77,000 people got access to clean water and 300,000 to basic sanitation services.



550,000 children in food insecure regions benefited from school feeding and micronutrient fortification.



Over 205,000 people in flood-affected areas received food assistance.



281,000 children aged 6-11 months and 2.1 million aged 12-59 months received Vitamin A and 5,600 children treated for acute malnutrition.



Shakarmoh Mahmurodova:

“I have a big family of 10 children and 7 grandchildren. Due to life difficulties, some of them had still no identity documents. UN and local municipality helped me to obtain birth certificates for my children and grandchildren. Now they are “visible” and able to access social services - education, health care and social protection”.



Outcome 2: Sustainable, inclusive, and green economic growth



Dilafruz Pakhlavonova:

“When my husband migrated abroad for work and faced with hardships there, I was left without any means to support myself and to raise and educate our child. With UN support me and many other women received training and support to grow food, diversify production, and improve our livelihoods. Now I own my greenhouse where we grow mushrooms that have higher value market and sell them in local and regional markets”.



National Action Plan for agricultural reform with a digitalization strategy finalized.



Over 170 businesses with enhanced tools and resources improved their productivity and competitiveness.



Over 13,000 benefited from job and skills programs, over half of them women.



A new policy on car sharing and car-pooling initiatives was developed to promote urban mobility.



Outcome 3: Integrated management of climate and environmental risk



Livelihoods of over 67,000 vulnerable people in under-served areas improved.



Over 6,600 people across 35 districts benefited from ecosystem-based interventions.



Over 214,000 people affected by disasters received humanitarian assistance.



670 technical specialists are trained on effective emergency and disaster preparedness planning and response.



Mahbuba Kholboboeva:

"I own a poultry chicken farm that was profitable, but we were struggling with electricity shortage. With a grant from UN we installed a 5 kW solar system and discovered the potential of solar energy. Now this system provides enough power to meet the needs of my business and my family, and we no longer worry about blackouts or fuel shortages. Our energy costs are down by more than 50 percent and profits are up to 9%. This solar system has been a lifesaver for us".



Outcome 4: People-centered governance and rule of law



Shuhrat Saidmurodov:

"I am very glad that I was a part of UN supported trainings on gender equality. The knowledge I received changed my whole life, as stereotypes about women are widespread in our neighborhood. As a young activist in my district I will challenge negative social norms, starting from my family".



First ever National Human Rights Strategy until 2038 adopted.



Legislative amendments removing age limitations for reporting complaints, (incl. related to SGBV), banning corporal punishment, and granting all children the right to be heard in judicial proceedings, adopted in 2023



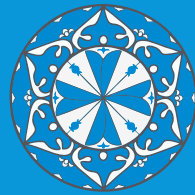
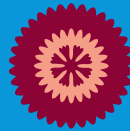
Over 2,000 civil servants and 330 CSO staff enhanced capabilities in implementing governance and judicial reform measures.



4,800 stateless persons and asylum seekers received counseling and legal advice. Identified 1,832 stateless individuals, facilitated Tajik citizenship for 3,379, supported 1,389 asylum-seekers out of which 651 recognized as refugees.



80 journalists and bloggers trained on using social networks for advocacy of freedom of speech and gender equality.
