

## Key Results in 2020

### COVID-19 Response



The UN provided **3.5 million** individuals with essential health services (vaccinations, hygiene kits, and maternal health services).



**35 hospitals** and 100 primary health care centers received essential medical equipment and pharmaceuticals for treatment of **18,000+** severe cases of COVID-19.



**6,317** kindergartens and schools and more than **87,000** teachers received training materials for the nation-wide back-to-school campaign.



**32,000** school community members received training on COVID-19 safety measures.



More than 1,000 women GBV survivors received PSS and legal support through UN supported hotlines.



More than **2.3 million** students received access to distance/home-based learning.



Almost 1000 small and medium sized enterprises (SMEs) and large companies were supported to implement policies to protect jobs and vulnerable workers.



More than 80 health service providers have received specialized training to provide psycho-social support (PSS). The government is opening ten new Victim Support Rooms able to provide 30 women with short-term shelter.

## Achieving the SDGs



The UN strengthened food systems and reduced malnutrition. The UN distributed school meals to **527,000** children in grades 1-4 across **2,000** schools in 52 districts. Take-home rations were distributed to **24,000** of the most vulnerable school children's families, totalling **120,000** individuals.



The UN also provided cash for work to vulnerable households, deployed locust resilience strategies and distributed **11 kg** of seeds to farmers and supported a crop yield of **18 tons** of vegetables for vulnerable communities.



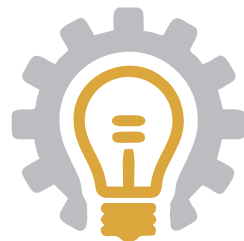
The UN supported disaster risk reduction and climate change adaptation interventions that reached **518,430** people (**57% women**) across **20** most vulnerable districts.
